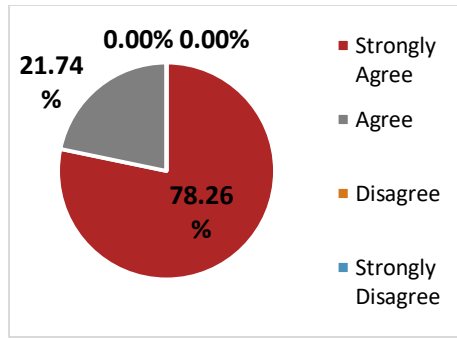




The course evaluation was completed by 46 of 109 registrants.

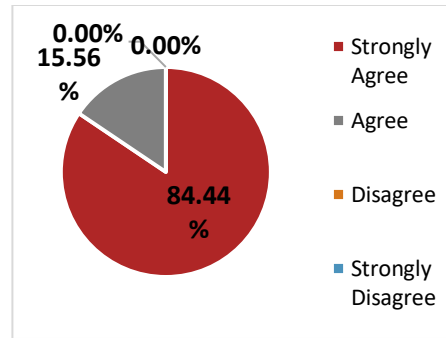
The evaluation was sent on November 21, 2020.

### Objectives



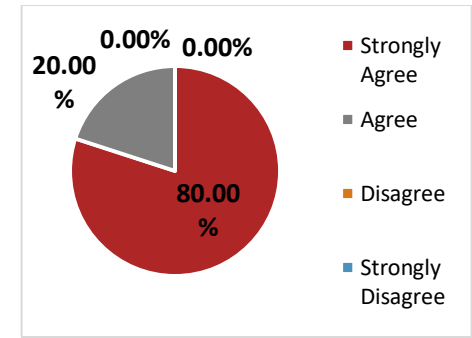
Overall, 100% agreed that the objectives were met.

### Relevancy



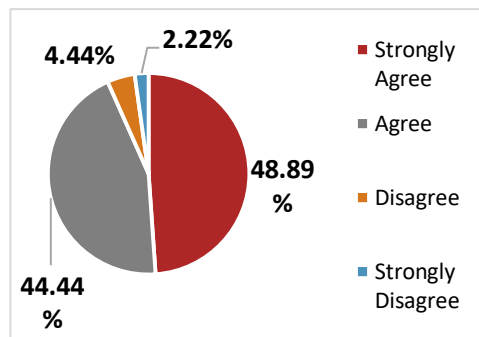
Overall, 100% felt the content was relevant to their practice or research.

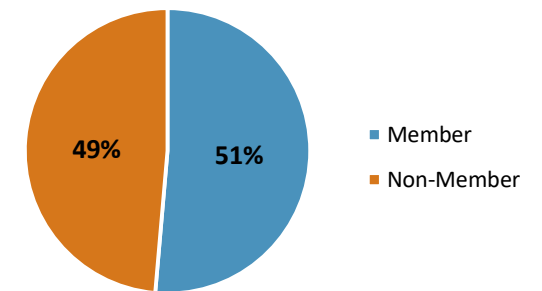
